


## Safran Landing Systems Limited Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement 2017

As a business we are committed to doing all we can to combat slavery and human trafficking. We will update our Company policies and procedures and put systems in place which will reflect our zero tolerance approach. We will endeavour to contact every supplier we do business with to certify that they mirror our values and complement our stance on the issue.

### Organisation Structure

Safran Landing Systems UK Limited (“We”) design and manufacture aircraft landing gear systems within the global Aerospace sector. We are a part of the Safran Landing Systems subsidiary (“SLS group”) of Safran SA (“Safran”), our ultimate parent company. Safran has over 58,000 employees worldwide and operates in more than 60 countries, with a turnover of 15.8 billion Euros in 2016. SLS group has over 7,200 employees worldwide, with the UK site based at Gloucester employing 1000 people.

SLS group has a global annual turnover of approximately 2 billion euros. We have an annual turnover of approximately £713 million, based on 2016 figures.

### Our Business

Safran Landing Systems group is made up of 4 divisions: Landing Gear & Systems Integration, Wheels & Brakes, Systems Equipment & MRO. SLS group is organised internationally on a matrix basis. The UK business is supported on a functional basis across that matrix organisation by a range of departments including: Engineering, Programs, Operations (Manufacturing, Processing & Assembly), Finance, Purchasing, Human Resources, IS, Quality, and Customer Services.

### Our Supply Chains

Safran Landing Systems UK Limited supply chain comprises approximately 170 product suppliers. These companies are based throughout the world and vary considerably both in terms of size and amount spent with them. All our product suppliers are subject to an approvals process before they are permitted to supply products to us. Many hold international quality standards and accreditations and are regularly audited both by the issuing authorities and ourselves to ensure ongoing compliance to quality standards and other regulatory requirements. In addition, we have 2,000 non-product suppliers who are managed by Safran UK. These suppliers are subject to similar due diligence processes as for the product suppliers.

**Our Policies on Slavery and Human Trafficking**

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. We will develop an Anti-slavery Policy that reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and auditing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

**Due Diligence Processes for Slavery and Human Trafficking**

We have a statement from every tier one supplier confirming they are compliant with the legislation. Statements will be requested from our tier one suppliers on an annual basis.

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we will amend our general terms and conditions of purchase to mandate compliance with the modern slavery act and will mandate that these terms are referenced on every purchase order.


**Training and awareness training**

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking, we will provide awareness brief to our senior leadership team and provide training to the supply chain teams. Training will be reviewed on an annual basis with new members to the Company receiving training as part of the Company's induction program.

**Further Steps**

We will periodically review the effectiveness of the steps we have taken to ensure there is no slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains, by continuously improving our policies, procedures and systems that we have implemented.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Safran Landing Systems Limited's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 2017.
